Outstanding Statistician of the Year Award to Peter McCullagh

Peter McCullagh has been nominated to receive the 1991 Statistician of the Year Award of the Chicago Chapter of the American Statistical Association. He will accept the award and speak at the May luncheon at noon on Tuesday, May 14, 1991 at the Midland Hotel (172 W. Adams at LaSalle). The title of his talk will be "Some Examples of Generalized Linear Models." He will be the twenty-fourth statistician to receive the award.

Professor McCullagh is presently on the statistics faculty of the University of Chicago. He received his Doctorate degree from the Imperial College in London. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Mathematical Statistics. He was recently selected to receive the 1990 Presidents' award from the Committee of Presidents of Statistical Societies (COPSS). He is also holder of the Royal Statistical Society Guy Medal in Bronze.

Dr. McCullagh is well known for his work in the development of generalized linear models. His book, co-authored with J.A. Nelder, Generalized Linear Models, was recently published in a second edition. He has also written a book, Tensor Methods in Statistics, which deals with ways of handling high dimensional arrays and associated inference problems. He also has published many papers dealing with important research on ordered categorical data, contingency tables and models for discrete multivariate responses.

Registration will start at 11:45 a.m. and lunch will be served, starting at noon.
